Social/emotional development

- ☐ Recognizes when others are in pain or upset, like becoming quiet when someone is sad
- ☐ Checks your facial expressions in unfamiliar situations to guide their response
- ☐ Settles down within a short time after being separated from you, such as at daycare
- ☐ Shows interest in other children and engages in play with them

Language/communication development

- ☐ Identifies objects in books when asked
- ☐ Combines at least two words when speaking
- ☐ Indicates different body parts when requested
- ☐ Uses various gestures to communicate, like nodding or shaking head
- ☐ Engages in simple back-and-forth conversations
- ☐ Begins to use question words like "what" or "where"
- ☐ Describes actions in pictures or books
- ☐ Responds with their name when asked
- ☐ Speaks clearly enough for most people to understand

Cognitive development

- ☐ Demonstrates ability to use both hands for different tasks simultaneously
- ☐ Explores how to operate simple mechanisms on toys
- ☐ Engages with multiple toys in imaginative play
- ☐ Attempts to copy simple shapes after demonstration
- ☐ Responds appropriately to warnings about danger, such as avoiding touching hot objects

Physical development

- ☐ Can kick a ball
- ☐ Able to run
- ☐ Climbs stairs walking upright, with or without assistance
- ☐ Uses a spoon for eating
- ☐ Standing on one foot
- ☐ Threads large objects together, like beads
- ☐ Begins to dress themselves partially
- ☐ Can use a fork during meals

Disclaimer: This milestone checklist is not a replacement for a standardized, validated developmental screening tool. It outlines the typical abilities of most children at various ages. Subject matter experts chose these milestones based on existing data and consensus.
