General Billing Tips

- Always verify patient insurance eligibility before the appointment.
- Ensure proper documentation of every visit to support the medical necessity.
- Familiarize yourself with common insurance requirements for chiropractic care.

Common Chiropractic CPT Codes

- 1. 98940 Chiropractic manipulative treatment (CMT); spinal, 1-2 regions
- 2. 98941 CMT; spinal, 3-4 regions
- 3. 98942 CMT; spinal, 5 regions
- 4. 98943 CMT; extraspinal, 1 or more regions

Evaluation and Management (E/M) Codes

- 99201-99205 New patient office visits
- 99211-99215 Established patient office visits
- 99202 Typical time for a new patient visit (20 minutes)

Diagnostic Imaging Codes

- 72020 Radiologic examination, spine, single view
- 72040 Radiologic examination, cervical spine, 2 or 3 views
- 72070 Thoracic spine, 2 views

Modifiers

- -25 Significant, separately identifiable evaluation and management service by the same physician on the same day of the procedure or other service.
- **-59** Distinct procedural service, indicates that services that are usually bundled into one payment were provided as separate services.
- -AT Acute treatment (This modifier is used to signify that a service was directly related to acute care phase treatment of a condition.)

Insurance Billing Tips

- Use modifier -25 when an E/M service is performed on the same day as a CMT to indicate that both services are significant and separately identifiable.
- Document every service provided during the visit, including the number of spinal regions treated and any additional therapies or modalities used.

Common Insurance Claim Denials & Solutions

Denial Reason: Lack of medical necessity.

• **Solution:** Ensure thorough documentation of the patient's condition and the rationale for treatment.

Denial Reason: Incorrect use of modifiers.

• Solution: Review modifier usage guidelines and apply appropriately.
