## Assessment

1. Nausea and vomiting: Ask, "Do you feel sick to your stomach? Have you vomited?". Observe.$0=$ no nausea and no vomiting1 = mild nausea with no vomiting

2. Tactile disturbances: Ask, "Have you any itching, pins and needles sensations, any burning, any numbness, or do you feel bugs crawling on or under your skin". Observe.$0=$ none1 = very mild itching, pins and needles, burning or numbness2 = mild itching, pins and needles, burning or numbness3 = moderate itching, pins and needles, burning or numbness

3. Tremor: With arms extended and fingers spread apart, observe.

4. Auditory disturbances: Ask "Are you more aware of sounds around you? Are they harsh? Do they frighten you? Are you hearing anything that is disturbing to you? Are you hearing things you know are not there?" Observe.

$\square 2=$ mild harshness or ability to frighten

5. Paroxysmal sweats: Observe.
$\square 0=$ no sweat visible1 = barely perceptible sweating, palms moist$2=$3 =4 = barely perceptible sweating, palms moist

6. Visual disturbances: Ask "Does the light appear to be too bright? Is its color different? Does it hurt your eyes? Are you seeing anything that is disturbing to you? Are you seeing things you know are not there?" Observe.$0=$ not present

$\square 2$ = mild sensitivity
$\square 3$ = moderate sensitivity
$\square 4=$ moderately severe hallucinations
$\square 5=$ severe hallucinations

7. Anxiety: Ask "Do you feel nervous?" Observe.

8. Headache, fullness in head: Ask "Does your head feel different? Does it feel like there is a band around your head?" Do not rate for dizziness or lightheadedness. Otherwise, rate severity

$\square 3$ = moderate
$\square 4$ = moderately severe5 = severe6 = very severe7 = extremely severe
9. Agitation: Observe.

10. Orientation and clouding of sensorium: Ask "What day is this? Where are you? Who am I?"
