

DSM 5 Antisocial Personality Disorder

DSM 5 Diagnostic Criteria

A. A pervasive pattern of disregard for and violation of the rights of others, occurring since age 15 years, as indicated by 3 (or more) of the following:

1. Failure to conform to social norms with respect to lawful behaviors
2. Deceitfulness
3. Impulsivity or failure to plan ahead
4. Irritability and aggressiveness
5. Reckless disregard for the safety of self or others
6. Consistent irresponsibility
7. Lack of remorse

B. The individual is at least age 18 years.

C. There is evidence of conduct disorder with onset before age 15 years.

The occurrence of antisocial behavior is not exclusively during the course of schizophrenia or bipolar disorder.
