Educate the patient:

 Strict avoidance of all shellfish and shellfish-derived products is imperative to prevent accidental exposure. This includes not only whole shrimp but also any dishes, sauces, or

condiments containing shellfish extracts or flavorings.

- Eat chicken, turkey, beef, and plant-based options like tofu or legumes instead.
- Make sure to inform server and/or kitchen when eating out. Avoid dishes made with utensils

that were also used to prepare shellfish.

Emergency Action Plan

- 1. Administer Epinephrine: If the patient exhibits any signs of an allergic reaction, administer epinephrine immediately using an auto-injector (e.g., EpiPen) into the outer thigh. Follow the instructions on the device.
- 2. Call 911: Dial 911 or activate the emergency response system without delay to request immediate medical assistance.
- 3. Keep Patient Calm and Monitor: While waiting for emergency responders, help the patient remain calm and seated. Monitor their vital signs and be prepared to perform CPR if necessary.

Prescribed Medications

- 1. In case of a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) characterized by difficulty breathing, swelling, hives, or vomiting after exposure to shellfish (shrimp), use your EpiPen immediately.
- 2. Remove the safety cap.
- 3. Hold the EpiPen with the orange tip facing downward.
- 4. Firmly jab the orange tip into the outer thigh, through clothing if necessary. It's okay if it makes a "click" sound that means it worked.
- 5. Hold it in place for a few seconds before removing.
- 6. Seek emergency medical assistance even after using the EpiPen, as its effects are temporary.
- 7. Remember to replace your EpiPen before its expiration date and carry it with you at all times.
