Nurse Practitioner Collaborative Agreement

1. **Purpose:** This Agreement is established by the laws and regulations of New York, governing the collaborative practice of nurse practitioners and physicians to facilitate the delivery of high-quality patient care.

2. Scope of Practice Authority

- The NP is authorized to perform the following activities within the scope of their advanced practice nursing licensure and by state laws and regulations:
 - Diagnosis and treatment of common acute and chronic health conditions.
 - Ordering and interpreting diagnostic tests and procedures.
 - Prescribing medications and treatments.
 - Providing patient education and counseling.
 - Referring patients to other healthcare providers as needed.
- The NP agrees to practice within this Agreement's agreed-upon protocols and guidelines and applicable laws.

3. Collaboration and Oversight

- The Collaborating Physician agrees to provide oversight and collaboration with the NP in the delivery of patient care.
- Regular communication and consultation between the NP and the Collaborating Physician will be maintained to ensure appropriate management of patient cases.
- The Collaborating Physician will periodically review a sample of patient charts, as outlined in the written practice protocols, and provide feedback as necessary.
- The NP will consult with the Collaborating Physician for guidance and direction in patient care requiring immediate attention or emergencies.

4. Documentation and Record-Keeping

- The NP will maintain accurate and up-to-date patient records, including medical history, assessments, treatments, and follow-up care.
- Patient charts will be made available for review by the Collaborating Physician upon request and by applicable laws and regulations.

5. Dispute Resolution

Any disagreements or disputes regarding patient care or interpretation of this
Agreement will be resolved through mutual discussion and agreement between the NP
and the Collaborating Physician.
