	Duloxetine (Cymbalta)	Depression, anxiety, diabetic neuropathy, fibromyalgia	30-120 mg daily	Nausea, dry mouth, sleepiness	Liver damage risk, interacts with CYP1A2 inhibitors like fluvoxamine
Tricyclic antidepressants	Amitriptyline	Depression, neuropathic pain, migraine prevention	25-150 mg daily	Dry mouth, constipation, drowsiness	Increased risk of serotonin syndrome with SSRIs, can increase arrhythmia risk
MAOIs	Phenelzine (Nardil)	Depression (especially atypical)	15-90 mg daily	Hypertension, insomnia, weight gain	Many dietary restrictions, severe interactions with SSRIs, certain pain medications
