Scoring Instructions

- The RAADS-R consists of 80 statements. Patients should rate their agreement with each statement on a scale of 0 to 3, where:
 - 0 = Never True
 - 1 = Rarely True
 - 2 = True Often
 - 3 = Almost Always True

Scoring Procedure

- Sum the scores for all 80 statements to obtain the Total Score (ranging from 0 to 240).
- Calculate subscale scores for Social Relatedness, Language, Sensory/Motor Issues, and Circumscribed Interests.
- Compare the Total Score and subscale scores to the interpretation guidelines below.

Interpretation

Total Score Interpretation

- □ 0-65: Within typical range (fewer autistic traits)
- □ 66-90: Mild to moderate autistic traits
- 91 and above: Significant autistic traits (may warrant further evaluation)

Subscale Scores Interpretation

Social Relatedness: High scores indicate challenges in social interaction and communication.

Language: Elevated scores suggest difficulties in language use.

Sensory/Motor Issues: Higher scores may indicate sensory sensitivities or motor coordination challenges.

Circumscribed Interests: Elevated scores imply strong, often repetitive, interests.
