## Guide:

- If several keys are present under a particular grade of severity, the presence of only one is required to qualify for that rating.
- One is encouraged to give whole or half points, especially if the patient doesn't follow the progression in the keys.
- Exception: If necessary, one can ignore the keys provided in the guides to indicate severity.

1. Elevated Mood0: Absent1: Mildly or possibly increased questioning
2: Definite subjective elevation; optimistic, self-confident; cheerful, appropriate to the content3: Elevated; inappropriate to content; humorous4: Euphoric; inappropriate laughter; singingOther: $\qquad$
